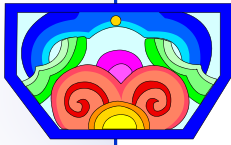

Transitions!

The beginning of September is the start of the new school year at the center. Between now and September 1st, children begin their transitions into their new classrooms, and start to get used to their new environments and routines. Everyone will be transitioned to their assigned classrooms for the upcoming school year no later than September 1st. This is an exciting time! New teachers, new things to play with, new playgrounds and new friends can be interesting and fun. It can also feel a little stressful to children and parents, just like any other change.

You will be given a written Transition Plan when it is time for your child to begin their transition to a new classroom. Once you receive notification that your child will be moving up, you can help make their transition more successful by talking to them about the move and about the exciting prospect of a new learning environment. You might say something like (for example): "Wow, you are getting so big! You are going to be a Toucan now! I think you will have so much fun in the Toucan's room".

You might want to take a walk over to your child's new room with them and chat with the teacher. Your reassurance will go a long way to helping your child feel good about the move.

While some children make the change with no problem at all, for others there may be an adjustment period and even a few tears,. But don't despair! The classroom teachers are skilled at helping children to adjust to a new environment. Usually within a couple of weeks, all of the children will have adjusted marvelously and you will find that your child has settled comfortably into their new classroom. Now they are ready for all of the age-appropriate activities and learning that will go on in their new room!!

Spanish For Kids

Children have an amazing capacity for learning language, and our Spanish class can help introduce your child to the Spanish language. Children meet in small groups of 5—8 children. They start by learning basic language skills, learning new nouns, the colors and numbers. Ms. Claudia teaches the class. She reads books, sings songs and plays games with the children. The class meets once a week for approximately 30 minutes each session and the cost is \$20 per month for this optional activity. Please see the front desk for enrollment information.

From the Kitchen

We are very fortunate to have a great kitchen staff and we're proud of our high quality food service at the Center! Our chef, Ms. Marina, ran a restaurant in Durham serving Mediterranean cuisine for a number of years. She and Ms. Silvia now cook many delicious meals for us at the center! We use lots of fresh, local produce provided by Ford's Produce, based at the Raleigh Farmer's Market. Our dishes are prepared from scratch—so, for example, when the menu says “Marina's Chicken Nuggets” the nuggets are made from fresh chicken breast coated in homemade bread crumbs and baked in the oven! Marina's pizzas and cinnamon rolls are hand-made using fresh yeast dough. We are very careful to restrict salt, sugar and fat in all of our menus. Recently the CACFP Food Program in Raleigh that manages the USDA food program in child care centers across the State, used our menus for training purposes for other programs as examples of healthy, well-balanced menus! We hope your child enjoys the wholesome and delicious meals at our program!

About the Board

Victory Village has a Board of Directors that is made up of University appointees, Hospital appointees, and parent representatives. The Board sets policy for the center and provides general oversight of and advice on operations. The center's Director reports to the Board. Board members are also available to parents and teachers who have questions or concerns they wish to share. The Board consists of three parent representatives, five university appointees, and five hospital appointees. Any parent is eligible to serve as a parent representative and need not be employed by the university or hospital. University and hospital appointees may be parents and must be employees. Board terms are effective September 1st of each year.

The Board meets at the center alternating between the fourth Monday of the month at 11:30 a.m. and the fourth Thursday of the next month at 6:00 p.m. You are invited to attend!
